One of three signature events hosted each year by Bradley Family Day, Inc., a nonprofit group of volunteers from public and private businesses centered in and around Bradley International Airport, the Not-So-Snooty Beer, Wine and Cheese Tasting Adventure raises funds in support of The Hole in the Wall Gang Camp.

Founded in Ashford, Connecticut by Paul Newman more than 20 years ago, The Hole in the Wall Gang Camp serves more than 15,000 children each year. At the Camp, children with illnesses like cancer, sickle cell anemia, HIV/AIDS and hemophilia find healing and camaraderie. As one Hole in the Wall camper puts it, "I love it here. Sometimes you think being so sick gives you limits, but here you can try anything."

In addition to its signature summer camp sessions and Hospital Outreach Programs, the Camp offers year-round family programming, camper reunions, parent respite weekends and caregiver

retreats. All of the camp's services are provided free of charge, thanks to the generosity of many donors and friends.
